

AT CAPITAL DAILY MARKET UPDATE – May 12, 2016

Overview

The DSEX closed at 4298.7 points, down by 19.8 points. The total transaction was worth BDT 3.1 bn.

Price of 106 issues appreciated whereas 157 issues declined and 46 others remained unchanged.

Market Commentary:

Market witnessed a downward trend as choppy traders dominated most of the session where there were some mixed declarations amid day long shut down called by Jamaat-e-Islami. Despite some initial sharp recovery of the lost points following negative start, DSEX, the prime index failed to continue its positive momentum as investors remained cautious and eventually ended at negative territory.

Later, the market moved in sideways with some degree of volatility and eventually closed at 4298.7, 0.5% lower than the previous session. Turnover came down to BDT 3.1 bn which is 3.3% lower than the last trading session.


Among the prominent sector Tannery, Food & Allied, Telecommunication, Pharma, Textile and Insurance outperformed the market.

Following the news of land sale, investors were speculating on regarding LINDEBD, which was the daily turnover leader contributing 6.9% to the total turnover posting 3.4% price return.



Three new ports come under container scanning system

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) is now set to bring four customs stations including a new land port station, a new sea port and a new inland container depot under a container scanning system to reduce clearing time, enhance trade facilitation and combat any possible threat against trade and national security.

As part of the initiative, the authorities have already handed over mobile container scanners to four custom houses-Benapole Customs House, Chittagong Customs House, Mongla Customs House and Inland Container Depot (ICD) Kamalapur-for installing them in the respective ports to ensure ease and reduce the cost of doing business.

Currently, only Chittagong Port has a mobile scanner and several container scanning machines.

Jamaat's hartal gets hardly any response
